# HVAC IN HEALTH CARE FACILITIES - BASED ON CAN/CSA Z317.2

#### COURSE OVERVIEW:

The ongoing supply of dependable indoor air quality is a critical health consideration, both to facility staff as well as the sick, infirm, and injured patients, who may be particularly susceptible to airborne infections and allergic reactions. Inadequate indoor air quality can complicate their care and necessitate extended hospital time.

This one-day seminar examines the requirements necessary to help ensure adequate indoor air quality in health care facility design, construction, and operation. CSA Standard Z317.2 provides criteria for the aspects of HVAC systems that are particular to health care facilities, and includes more stringent requirements – above and beyond those generally applied in designing, constructing and operating traditional HVAC systems.

# MANAGING ESSENTIAL ELECTRICAL SYSTEMS IN HEALTH CARE FACILITIES – AS RELATED TO STANDBY GENERATORS

#### COURSE OVERVIEW:

Health Care facilities are highly dependent on reliable sources of electrical power as emergencies can arise at any time. Health Care facility owners and managers are responsible for ensuring public safety within their buildings at all times, regardless of external conditions. In addition, they are charged with ensuring the safe and efficient operation of equipment and facilities at all times. A critical element in health care facilities is the essential electrical system.

Several codes and regulations across Canada specify the requirement for essential electrical systems in health care buildings. The most referenced standards for these codes and regulations are CSA C282-05 "Emergency Electrical Power Supply for Buildings" and CSA Z32-04 "Electrical Safety and Essential Electrical Systems in Health Care Facilities".

The lives of patients and staff in residence as well as the safety of building occupants and emergency responders are dependant upon the ongoing safe and dependable operation of critical life-safety equipment. This important workshop outlines the design and maintenance requirements necessary to help ensure the effective operation of your essential power system in the event of power failure.
